Baya Mahieddine was a Kabyle girl born in 1931 in an Algiers suburb and was raised by her grandmother after she was orphaned at age five. At age 11, she was taken in as a servant by a French woman living in Algiers who was an art collector and immediately recognized Baya's artistic talent in the clay figurines that she crafted. She was entirely self-taught yet, with the help of Caminat's connections, Baya was able to travel to Paris for her first exhibit in Aime Maeght's gallery. This is where her influence on artists like Picasso is first noted.
